

Funding and Finance Options Template Development

Funding, Finance, and Programming Options for your Community Resilience Center

This section is designed to support the implementation of your Community Resilience Center recommendations report by providing grounding principles, tailored funding and finance options, and programming ideas. Use this information to keep conversations and action moving forward for your CRC.

General principles for maximizing opportunities to access funding and finance:

- Use multi-scale, cross-sector partnerships to increase project capacity: consider collaborating with other library sites or community institutions.
- Get buy-in from community and government leaders in positions of power: for libraries, this will likely be elected public officials who dictate the library budget.

CRC Programming Options

You likely have many ideas already for expanding current programming to meet your CRC needs. This list provides ideas and resources for aligning current programming with climate resilience needs or developing new programming to reach your CRC goals, both during emergencies and on an ongoing basis.

• Community engagement in building and site upgrades (e.g. guiding values and community priorities, design input, workforce development/training, education about upgrades, volunteer opportunities to support upgrades)

Funding and Finance Options

There are many funding and finance opportunities available to support continued planning and implementation of your CRC goals. Below are sample opportunities that may apply across many BayREN Resilient Libraries Network Initiative sites. While these are organized by activity type, some of the opportunities may be relevant to more than one type of activity. For example, the Community Development Block Grants (CDBG) program. Resilience Funding and Finance experts will work with you and your CRC team to tailor this chart for your CRC site based on your goals and critical needs.

Suggested initial next steps
